 - o Hackers changed chemical mix of the drinking water
 - Hackers obtained credentials for remote control software and actually gained access to the internal systems
 - Remote control software installed to allow contractors to have access to internal systems

- Hack took advantage of an unsupported version of windows
- A major issue comes from making industrial control systems IP accessible and that level of access was not available before
 - Controls may not keep up with requirements
- Mac expressed that he misses the old "off the record" forums that used to be offered at the old security
- Is ransomeware still around?
 - Ray Pompon reported it comes and goes
 - Seemed to peak at the end of summer
 - Some changes and some are more stealthy
